### **Activities**

**Roman-period pottery found in West Sussex (c.AD70-410).  
A Study Day led by Gordon Hayden.**

The course outline:

The day will consist of the identification of the most common pottery types found in West Sussex, from the formal absorption of this particular area into the Roman Empire (c.AD70), until the end of Roman period.

Through the use of presentations and a sorting session, the most common pottery types will be studied with the aim of differentiating between local, regional and imported wares.

### **Introduction to QGIS, a Practical Guide: a study day led by Mark Seaman, Mike Kallaway and Brian Tomkinson**

The course outline: This is an introductory course to the most commonly used graphical information system, QGIS. The objective is to introduce delegates to this powerful set of tools and use QGIS to achieve basic but very useful results. It is a practical course, and delegates should bring a laptop previously loaded with QGIS. Instructions to load up QGIS will be sent out beforehand. Course notes will be provided for future reference.

Assistance will be provided on the course if any difficulties are encountered. If a laptop is not available then one can be shared. We will use one of our laptops to project on to the screen and work through the course material.

### **Textiles: A study day led by Sue Wallis**

The course outline: Textiles require a huge amount of time and resources to produce. Surviving evidence of textiles and textile technology is often scanty. The significance of textile production to our ancestors is easy to overlook. An understanding of the history of textiles is fascinating and gives insights into the levels of interconnectedness of ancient societies. The study day will give an overview of the evidence for ancient textiles and an opportunity to have 'hands on' experience of some of the technology. The leader of the Study Day has a strongly scientific background and is currently Chairman of the Cambridgeshire Guild of Weavers, Spinners and Dyers. She has always had an interest in textiles and has been a weaver since 2010.
